




Ms. Waring admitted to Stonegate Nursing and Rehab after having a fall at home resulting in a hospitalization. Ms. Waring, being a retired nurse aesthetician, knew she needed to work on some strength and balance prior to returning home to her ranch. She lived on several acres, had four large dogs, two cats and other animals to attend to.

Upon evaluation by physical therapy, she was noted to require minimal assistance with transfers and was able to walk 50 feet with minimal assistance. The occupational therapy evaluation showed she needed standby by assistance with upper body tasks and minimal assistance with lower body dressing, bathing, and toileting.

Since Ms. Waring was at a high-level of function on admission, therapy focused on strengthening, dynamic balance, righting reactions, steps, and item retrieval from low surfaces. She quickly achieved her goals and was able to return home with her roommate! Way to go Ms. Waring!
