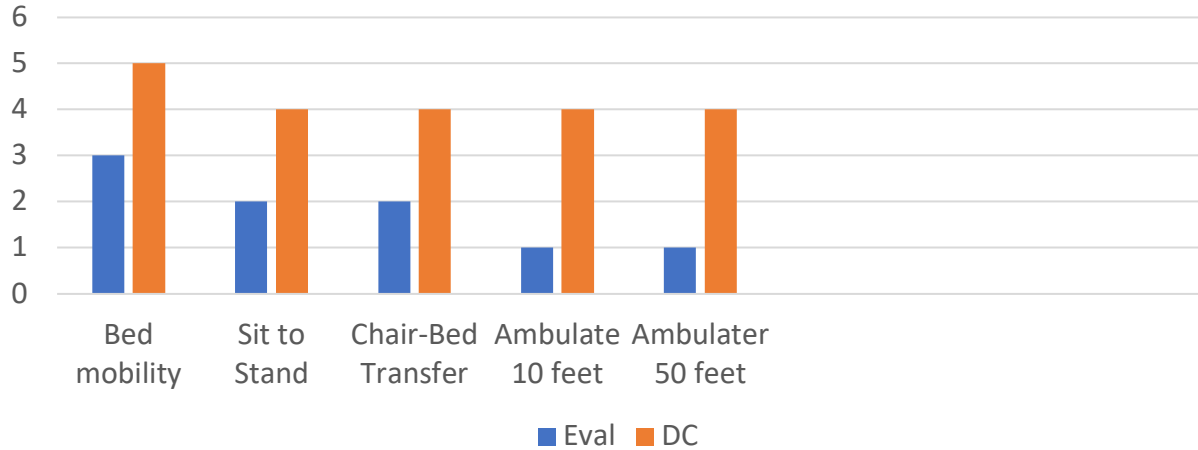
SUCCESSFULLY DISCHARGED FROM THERAPY: 7/24/24

Ms. Williams was an 84-year-old woman who admitted to us at Stonegate Nursing and Rehab after having a fall which resulted in a right hip fracture and lumbar fractures. Ms. Williams was a retired school cafeteria manager who always wore a smile and had a sense of humor brightened the room.

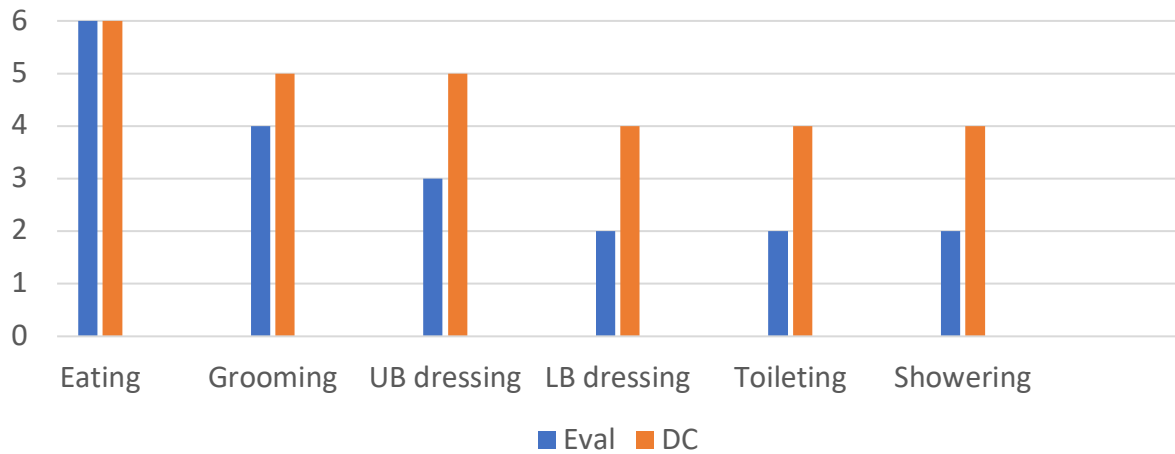
Upon evaluation by physical therapy, she required moderate assistance with bed mobility and maximum assistance with transfers. She was toe-touch weight bearing which limited her ability to walk. Her occupational therapy evaluation indicated that she required minimal assistance with grooming, moderate assistance with upper body dressing, and maximum assistance with lower body dressing, toileting, and bathing.

Ms. Williams never turned down a therapy session. Her daughter visited daily and supported her along the way. She advanced from toe-touch weight bearing to weight bearing as tolerated which facilitated more progress. At discharge, she required supervision with bed mobility, contact guard assist with transfers, and was able to walk 100 feet with contact guard assist. She was able to perform all upper body activities of daily living with set up and lower body tasks with minimal assistance. She will be missed!

MDS Section GG Functional Scores

06 - Independent

Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper

05- Setup or clean-up assistance

Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.

04 - Supervision or touching assistance

Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.

03 - Partial/moderate assistance

Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs but provides less than half the effort.

02 - Substantial/maximal assistance

Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.

01 - Dependent

Helper does ALL the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
